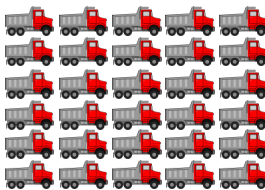
Cost Share Available!

Would you be upset? Would you call the police and file charges? That is your farm; your livelihood!

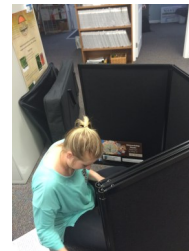
When living roots aren't kept in soil year-round, topsoil is lost at an alarming rate! If you began adding cover crops, you could lose as little as 5 dump trucks of soil. It's not perfect, some erosion will happen; but what a difference a root makes!
